From Troas we put out to sea and sailed straight for Samothrace, and the next day we went on to Neapolis. From there we traveled to Philippi, a Roman colony and the leading city of that district of Macedonia. And we stayed there several days. On the Sabbath we went outside the city gate to the river, where we expected to find a place of prayer. We sat down and began to speak to the women who had gathered there. One of those listening was a woman from the city of Thyratira named Lydia, a dealer in purple cloth. She was a worshiper of God. Acts 16:13-14a

Expectations

Timothy, Paul, Silas and Luke, as well as some others, are traveling throughout the Roman Empire spreading the gospel and strengthening the churches. Spending some time in Philippi, a city where there was no synagogue, they began to search outside the city for a *proseuche*, a place of prayer.

They apparently found such a place by a nearby river, today known as the Zygaktis River. Today there stands a small chapel at the site where it is believed that Paul bapitized Lydia. A short distance away stands a Greek Orthodox Church also commemorating the baptism of the first European convert to Christianity.

The curious among us would have to ask; how would Paul and his fellow companions recognize this "place of prayer" when they found it? The answer was quite simple. They went looking for a place where believers were gathered. There in the lush, serene landscape beside the river where no church or chapel had yet stood they find several women, worshippers of God, who had gathered to pray.

When those who come seeking a place to pray come into our churches, our meetings, our events will they find a "place of prayer?" How will they know? Will they find worshippers of God, praying believers and the message of the gospel proclaimed? The building, the steeple, the ringing of the bell, the meetings, the events are all ways to draw attention, to bring them here. But it is up to you to show them the place of prayer they are seeking by reflecting the One we all pray to!
